# **MEAT-FARE SUNDAY**

Today's Gospel reading is Matthew 25:31-46, the parable of the Last Judgment. It reminds us that while trusting in Christ's love and mercy, we must not forget His righteous judgment when He comes again in glory. If our hearts remain hardened and unrepentant, we should not expect the Lord to overlook our transgressions simply because He is a good and loving God. Although He does not desire the death of a sinner, He also expects us to turn from our wickedness and live (Ezek. 33:11). This same idea is expressed in the prayer read by the priest after the penitent has confessed his or her sins (Slavic practice).

The time for repentance and forgiveness is now, in the present life. At the Second Coming, Christ will appear as the righteous Judge, "Who will render to every man according to his deeds" (Rom. 2:6). Then the time for entreating God's mercy and forgiveness will have passed.

As Father Alexander Schmemann reminds us in his book GREAT LENT (Ch. 1:4), sin is the absence of love, it is separation and isolation. When Christ comes to judge the world, His criterion for judgment will be love. Christian love entails seeing Christ in other people, our family, our friends, and everyone else we may encounter in our lives. We shall be judged on whether we have loved, or not loved, our neighbor. We show Christian love when we feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, visit those who are sick or in prison. If we did such things for the least of Christ's brethren, then we also did them for Christ (Mt.25:40). If we did not do such things for the least of the brethren, neither did we do them for Christ (Mt.25:45).

Today is the last day for eating meat and meat products until Pascha, though eggs and dairy products are permitted every day during the coming week. This limited fasting prepares us gradually for the more intense fasting of Great Lent.



> Ask the Theotokos to offer you and the world pure thoughts and ideas this week.


> > Place your palm branches and pussywillows behind an icon at home and in your car!

# Taras Hryhorovych Shevchenko

Today, Sunday, March 10, 2023, a "Panaxida" in memory of Taras Shevchenko will be served immediately after the Divine Liturgy

Taras was born March 9, 1814 in Morynsti, Ukraine, the foremost Ukrainian poet, prose writer, artistpainter, public and political figure, as well as folklorist and ethnographer and playwright of the 19<sup>th</sup> century. His literary heritage is regarded to be the foundation of modern Ukrainian literature. He was a major figure of the Ukrainian National Revival.

Shevchenko was a man of universal talents. All his life and creative work were dedicated to the people of Ukraine. The poet dreamed about the times when his Country would be a free sovereign state, where the Ukrainian language, culture and history would be highly valued, and the people would be joyful and free. Shevchenko had a unique place in Ukrainian culture, history, and world literature. Through his writings, (poems) known as the "KOBZAR", laid the foundations for the creation of a fully functional modern Ukrainian literature.

Born a serf, Shevchenko was freed in 1838 while a student at the St. Petersburg Academy of Fine Arts. In early 1847, he started to work as a teacher of visual arts at the Kyiv University. There is became a member of the Saints Cyril and Methodius Brotherhood and an academician of the Imperial Academy of Arts. When this Brotherhood was supressed by the Russian authorities, Shevchenko was punished by exile and compulsory military service for writing his poetry, which satirized the oppression of Ukraine by Russia. Though forbidden to write and paint, he did write a few lyrical poems during the first years of his exile.

In 1857, Taras was allowed to return to St. Petersburg. In 1859 he managed to come to Ukraine, yet he was refused the right to live in his Homeland permanently, so he was forced to return to St. Petersburg. During his ten year long exile, his health was ruined and on March 10, 1861, Taras Shevchenko passed away.

The name of Taras Shevchenko is very well known throughout the world. Monuments in his memory were erected in numerous countries, including Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada. His literary works were translated into almost all languages of the world. The National Opera House, Kyiv National University, a central boulevard in Kyiv as well as many establishments, streets and squares bear the name of the Great Ukrainian Poet and artist – TARAS SHEVCHENKO.

The Museum, founded in 1950, cultivates the diverse knowledge and appreciation of the experiences, cultures, and histories of Ukrainians in Canada, Ukraine, and the diaspora. Details of our activity are described in our website www.umcmb.ca. The Museum is incorporated in the Province of Manitoba and is a registered, non-profit charity with Canada Revenue.

# Primary Responsibilities of the Museum Interpreter are:

- Guiding individual/group tours through the Museum, educating visitors about the history of Ukrainians in Canada and the diaspora.
- English language required and Ukrainian language would be an asset.
- Providing visitor service and a positive experience for guests.
- Gift shop duties.
- Answering the phone, responding to questions related to the Museum and redirecting calls.
- Assisting with curatorial, collections management and research projects.
- Performing start-of-day and end-of-day tasks such as security protocols, and leaving the Museum in good order.

# Primary responsibilities of the Curatorial Assistant are:

- Assist with display and storage of artifacts to ensure proper conservation methods.
