CHEESE-FARE SUNDAY - SUNDAY OF FORGIVNESS

Today we in the Orthodox Church have arrived at the Sunday of Forgiveness or Cheesefare Sunday. The Gospel for this Sunday is Matthew 6:14-21, which speaks of the importance of Forgiveness and in another aspect, the importance of fasting, but not for show but rather for one's own soul.

In the Church, this is the last day on which the eating of dairy and egg products is allowed. On Monday which is often referred to as Pure or Clean Monday, Great Lent Begins, a period in which we are exhorted to fast from meat, fish, dairy and egg products.

In the earliest days of Christianity, only two days of fasting were designated prior to Pascha, later it involved the entire week from Palm Sunday to Pascha. By the 4th century, the period of fasting had been extended an additional 40 days in imitation of Jesus' 40 days of fasting in the wilderness. Most if not all monasteries observe this strict form of fasting, whereas, many in the modern times, because of personal reasons etc., have modified their strict observance. But as the Gospel Lesson says, our fasting should be done in private and that we should not gloat over those for whatever reason do not follow the strict, correct form of the fast. It is indeed admirable if one is able to observe the fast as prescribed for it does help especially with one's own prayer life, for Lent, is a very intimate preparation to meet the Lord.

All Orthodox Christians should fast, but each person and each family must prayerfully choose and commit themselves to a specific fasting discipline that is suitable to their own circumstance and that they can keep. Strict fasting in the early Church meant no eating of food at all during the day and after eating sparingly. Whatever your discipline, some sort of fasting is good for the soul and for one's prayer life.

So let us set out upon the fast with joy, preparing ourselves for spiritual combat. Let us purify our souls and cleanse ourselves for spiritual battle. Let us purify our souls and cleanse our bodies, so as we fast from food, let us also fast from every evil passion, rejoicing in the virtues of the spirit!

> Bring an icon to church for a procession.

Bring a prayer rope to be blessed today! Use it and pray the Jesus Prayer each day this week.

Wear your cross to church and kiss the cross each morning with a bow!

Every time you climb stairs this week ask St. John to help you reach Paradise with the sign of the cross!

> Ask the Theotokos to offer you and the world pure thoughts and ideas this week.

> > Place your palm branches and pussywillows behind an icon at home and in your car!


Refrain from TV, Internet & Phones to honor Christ's Death.

The Museum, founded in 1950, cultivates the diverse knowledge and appreciation of the experiences, cultures, and histories of Ukrainians in Canada, Ukraine, and the diaspora. Details of our activity are described in our website www.umcmb.ca. The Museum is incorporated in the Province of Manitoba and is a registered, non-profit charity with Canada Revenue.

Primary Responsibilities of the Museum Interpreter are:

- Guiding individual/group tours through the Museum, educating visitors about the history of Ukrainians in Canada and the diaspora.
- English language required and Ukrainian language would be an asset.
- Providing visitor service and a positive experience for guests.
- Gift shop duties.
- Answering the phone, responding to questions related to the Museum and redirecting calls.
- Assisting with curatorial, collections management and research projects.
- Performing start-of-day and end-of-day tasks such as security protocols, and leaving the Museum in good order.

Primary responsibilities of the Curatorial Assistant are:

- Assist with display and storage of artifacts to ensure proper conservation methods.
- Assist with researching origins and provenance of artifacts and assist with cataloguing artifacts.
- Develop story lines and themes in order to help organize displays and exhibits, including online exhibits.
- Assist in producing and disseminating promotional materials using digital technology.
- English language and some fluency in the Ukrainian language required.
- Maintain security during open hours and follow security protocols when leaving.

Competencies/Experience:

• Must be between the ages of 15 and 30, and meet all other eligibility criteria for the Canada Summer Jobs Program. Must be a permanent resident.
